A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Friends,

Christmas and Easter are the biggest, most well-known days of the Christian year. Pentecost is really the third "high holy day" of Christianity, although it gets far less attention. Perhaps it is because Christmas and Easter have become holidays on which families gather. Or the more cynical (or more honest—you decide!) among us may say it's because Christmas and Easter are the most commercialized outside the church. Whatever the reason, these two days are big for Christians and non-Christians alike.

But what I love best about both Christmas and Easter is that the church calendar gives us a season of preparation for each of them. Advent leads up to Christmas and helps us focus on more than parties and decorations, travel and gift giving. Lent leads up to Easter and offers a similar sense of focus.

Historically Lent has been a time of preparation for those new to the faith as they prepare to make faith commitments. It has also been a time of recommitment for all Christians as we realign our living with our faith values. In a sense Lent gives us an opportunity, much like the beginning of the calendar year, to claim again who we are, who we want to be, and to commit to living in those ways.

So, it is very intentional that we offer small groups during Lent. We call these groups Spiritual Life Groups and recognize them as a time to deepen our connection to God and to each other. We do this work in community because our faith calls us to live in community and care for community. While faith is rooted in a personal relationship with God, it is not about us. Rather our faith calls us outward, into the world, into relationships. I am reminded of the quote I shared Sunday from Joel Bengbeng, United Methodist District Superintendent in the Philippines, "God...abhors liturgy detached from justice, prayer devoid of compassion, ritual not translated into mercy, and offerings not couples with sacrificial love for others (from *The Upper Room Disciplines 2023*, reading for January 24, 2023). We gather together for intentional conversation and exploration of our faith in order that it changes who we are and how we interact with the world.

I hope that you will sign up to participate in a Spiritual Life Group. There are several offered - at different times throughout the week and different places around the community (including on Zoom). I always find participation in these groups meaningful and trust you will, too. <u>Use this link to sign up</u> or call the church office.

And, remember, there are several other opportunities you are currently invited to sign up for.



Throughout time, people have turned to the arts to express their thoughts and emotions while incarcerated: memories, hopes for the future, regrets, work that expresses love for family, political commentary, humor, doodles that have helped pass the hours. **Art From the Inside Out** is meant to celebrate the talent and hard work of these artists as well as promote public awareness of the humanity and resilience of incarcerated people.

The Artifactory gallery is officially open on Saturday afternoons from 1-4 pm for people to view the exhibit and special appointments can also be made for groups on weekdays or evenings.
