## A Note From Your Pastor

Friends,

Last week I talked about transitions. One thing that is transitioning around here is the frequency of our newsletters. For some of you this isn't a big deal. For others it may feel like a friend is visiting less frequently. It is our intention to continue to communicate regularly. Meanwhile, we also know that repetitive communication can get tiring.

#### Here's our intention:

Throughout the months of April and May we are going to shift from a weekly newsletter to sending one every other week. The next newsletters will come out April 12 and 26, as well as May 10 and 24. We are exploring moving to a monthly newsletter starting in June. What this means is that we ask everyone who has information to communicate about groups and ministries at First Christian to get the next month's information to us by the end of the current month. For example, we would love to know all the May details no later than April 24 so they can be included in the newsletter that goes out April 26. Likewise, June details will be included in the May 24 newsletter and should be to the office no later than May 22. We are hoping that this slow move from weekly to bi-weekly to monthly will help make this transition smooth.

But, what about when things come up between newsletters? We still have several other opportunities for communication:

- Our Saturday email always has the listing of the upcoming week's events. We will begin mailing that via USPS to those without email on the weeks when a newsletter is not being published.
- If you are on Facebook, make sure you are part of the "First Christian Church of Iowa City Connection" group. If you aren't, please talk to myself or one of the other pastors and we'll get you connected. We share lots of information there and you all can post things as well. We also have a "First Christian Church (Disciples) of Iowa City" page. This is a public page so we don't put personal information on it, but do announce events. If you are on Facebook, I hope you have or will "like" it.
- Each Sunday we print a handout with prayer concerns and upcoming events.
- We periodically send out additional emails if there is something urgent. If you know of people who don't have email, I'd encourage you to share information that you know they would care about when these emails arrive.

We appreciate both you patience and your feedback in this transition.


## **DID YOU KNOW?**

Marketers of all kinds of consumer services price their products in small monthly amounts, rather than an annual total. The thinking is that we will gladly pay \$4.99 per month for something we wouldn't dream of paying \$60 a year! Put that same principle to work when thinking about your stewardship of the resources you've been given.

For our annual stewardship emphasis for the church—and for things like our upcoming capital campaign—think about what you can commit in weekly or monthly increments. Think about how much more you could do per week if you forego one nice lunch out per week. When you multiply that to an annual total, or for the campaign a three-year total, you might be surprised that you're able to give more than you thought.




