A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Lent. It is a season of intention. I hope you are finding some meaningful ways to connect with it. And I am always interested to hear what you do find meaningful and helpful in such seasons.

I have to admit that at the beginning of the season I am often too caught up in planning for the season to dive right into my intentions. As Lent begins, your church staff is both in the midst of leading (and trying to model) Lenten practices and also continuing to plan for the rest of the season including Holy Week and Easter.

Isn't that the way life is whether in our workplaces, family lives, or any aspect? We are simultaneously living in the midst of each day and also anticipating what is yet to come (with memories also finding their way into the rhythm). It is here where we seek to find balance...to be present in this moment, this day...to be ready for what comes tomorrow...to carry with us what has mattered before. While this can sometimes seem like a lot, it is also the work of living, and the work of Lent.

What's on the table changes all the time...see if there is something there you might enjoy!


